Volunteer with PBRC's Unaccompanied Children Pro Bono Project.

- ◆ **10,000** unaccompanied children have come to Maryland in the last THREE years, seeking safety and refuge from violence in their home counties.
- ◆ Children represented by an attorney are 5 times more likely to stay in the US.
- ◆ Volunteer attorneys and interpreters can help these children gain access to critical legal assistance with their valid defenses to deportation.
- ◆ Attorneys can choose to volunteer with PBRC for a couple of hours at a screening clinic at Baltimore Immigration Court or take a case from a project partner.
- ◆ Training, malpractice insurance, mentoring, and more are available.

Baltimore Immigration Bond Hearing Observation Project

The Baltimore Immigration Bond Hearing Observation Project is looking for volunteers willing to observe bond hearings at the Baltimore Immigration Court. Observers are expected to take notes on the detainees, their legal situation and their stories. The information is entered into a spreadsheet in order to facilitate connecting unrepresented detainees with attorneys willing to take on the case. Volunteers must be available on a Monday or Wednesday morning from 8:30 a.m. until the docket is exhausted around noon (if a volunteer cannot stay for the entire session on a Monday or Wednesday, the time commitments can be divided up as long as this is scheduled ahead of time). We prefer volunteers able to commit to at least two observations per month.

The ABA Commission on Immigration is seeking talented law clerks and interns to assist in cutting-edge, individualized assistance to detainees held by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Duties of interns consist of communicating with immigration detainees in ICE custody in detention centers, determining what information may assist them, and assembling the appropriate materials. Interns are trained in identifying specific complaints regarding the condition of detention centers and they assist in drafting complaint letters.

Suitable for family law practitioners or beginners. Cases placed with volunteers by Unaccompanied Children Pro Bono Project partners.
